Building Better Partnerships

Unwritten Rules to Improve Communication:

- 1. Always raise your partner with 4-card support
- 2. Play only conventions with which you and your partner are comfortable
- 3. Describe your hand once... once is enough
- 4. Look at the auction through your partner's eyes. Picture his hand from his auction and consider how he is picturing yours from your auction
- 5. Trust partner ... partner is your friend

Some Suggestions:

Overcalls suggest opening leads. Overcalling based on length is normal, but be careful to overcall suits in which you can tolerate partner's lead.

Doubles may suggest penalty or they may be for take-out. Penalty doubles are made more frequently in high level auctions. Take-out doubles are made most often at low levels.

If you hold an opening hand with shortness in clubs and your RHO opens the bidding 1♣, you may choose to double. This double asks partner to bid his long suit and suggests you will have a fit for that suit. If partner holds ten or more points, he should jump in the suit he is bidding. If partner holds less, he should bid the suit at the cheapest level he can. However, no matter how bad his hand is, he cannot pass a take-out double unless he holds extreme length in the suit you have doubled.

The purpose of the auction is to find the correct strain and level for play. To do this, partners communicate their values to one another through bidding.

There are only eight bidding words: spades, hearts, diamonds, clubs, no-trump, double, redouble, pass and seven numbers with which to do this.

To determine the proper level at which to play, you must listen intently to what partner tells you. Does he have an opening hand? Once you have discerned from the bidding that you have adequate points for game or slam, you must be sure to keep the auction alive to get there.

To determine the proper strain, again you must listen to what partner is saying. If he raises your suit and you have five of that suit, it is correct to play there. If he is bidding your short suits, it is usually correct to play no-trump.


Bidding and partnership are strengthened when I tell you mine and you tell me yours!

Don't be afraid to get too high. It happens to all of us. Be kind when partner errs... believe me, you will err too.

Inverted Minors by Lynn Koskie

Inverted Minors exchanges the meanings of the simple and double raises of 1 rianleq / 1 rianleq. For simplicity, the examples and situations described herein will be based on an opening bid of 1 rianleq.

After 14, a simple raise to 24 is a one-round force, promising at least ten points and four clubs. A jump raise to 34 is preemptive, showing 5-8 points and at least five clubs (although excellent four-card support is permissible). Both raises deny a four-card major suit.



Opener's rebids after partner has bid 2♣ are:

2♦: 14+ points with a four-card diamond suit, forcing

2♥: heart stopper (usually 3+ hearts), forcing

2♠: spade stopper (usually 3+ spades), forcing

2NT: Shows 12-14 points with a balanced hand

3♠: A catchall bid denying the ability to make any other bid.

3NT: 18-19 points with a balanced hand

Responder's rebids to $2 \neq /2 \neq /2 \triangleq$ are:

2NT: 10-12 with a balanced hand 3. A minimum unbalanced hand 3NT: 13-15 with a balanced hand

A raise of opener's second suit: 3+ trumps, invitational

A new suit: Showing or Asking for a stopper, depending on agreement

Some pairs play Inverted Minors in both uncontested and competitive auctions. It is a matter of partnership agreement whether to play Inverted Minors in competition.
