

# **District 13 Grand National Teams**

## **Conditions of Contest – 2025-2026**

### **Time and Place**

Play in the Championship Flight, Flight A and Flight B will take place Saturday, February 21, 2026 & Sunday, February 22, 2026, at the Good Hope School Room 26, 2315 W Good Hope Road, Glendale, WI. Play in Flight C will commence and conclude all on Sunday, February 22, 2026.

Championship, Flight A and Flight B will take place over 4 sessions and will be concluded in a single weekend.

### ***Basic Format***

The same basic format will be used in each flight except Flight C. There will be no competition among flights. There will be two stages of play in the top three flights – a complete round-robin (or, at the discretion of the District Coordinator, a Swiss Team if more than 12 teams are entered in a flight) leading to a KO bracket. Flight C will be contested in a one-day Swiss Team format on Sunday.

### **Stage 1**

Stage 1 will consist of the first two sessions of play on Saturday. Teams will play a complete round robin (or Swiss Team) within each flight. Sessions will be 22-28 boards in length, depending upon the requirements of the movement (See Table A – RR Match Lengths). Individual match scores will be based upon IMP's converted to a USBF style 20 VP scale. The number of qualifying teams will be announced when the final number of entries is known.

It is expected that the Championship Flight will be reduced to four teams at the end of the first day. Flights A & B are generally larger and a cut to between five and eight teams is anticipated for those flights. If fewer than ten teams enter, four teams will qualify for Sunday play. If ten or more teams are entered, our guideline is to qualify fifty percent of the field, rounded down. The concept is to allow teams the maximum number of boards to qualify and to generate the maximum number of boards played between eventual semi-finalists and finalists. No teams will be eliminated prior to the end of the first day.

## KO Stage

The KO stage will consist of two sessions of play on Sunday. The number of boards will be 32 in each match.

If five or more teams qualify for the Sunday event, a second round-robin of approximately 32 total boards (with full carryover) will be held on Sunday afternoon to reduce the field to two finalists, who will play on Sunday night.

Semi-Final KO brackets will be determined solely by the results of the Saturday qualifying rounds. The winner of the qualifying round will select its opponent from the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place teams. In the case of a tie in the qualifying round standings, the tie will be broken by the results of the head-to-head matches among the tying teams. If this method does not break the tie, a coin flip will be used to break the tie.

### Carry Over in KO Matches

If there has been a complete round-robin in the preliminary stage, there will be full carry-over into the KO stage.

If the flight did not include a complete round-robin, there will be no carry over into the finals.

### Ties

Should a semi-final or final KO match end in a tie, one 4-board segment followed by 2-board segments will be played until the tie is broken. There will be no seeding rights in a playoff. A team may field any four of its players for a playoff. Both teams shall submit written lineups in advance to the director.

Players in the District Finals must meet the residency requirements of the ACBL GNT Conditions of Contest. Each member of the team must be a paid member in good standing with the ACBL. Club or Unit level qualifying is not required for participation in the District final, but clubs may hold Club level GNT Qualifying sessions, if authorized by a club's Unit organization.

In addition, players who are currently, or have ever been in the past, members of another bridge organization (whether domestic or foreign), must submit information on their past and/or current ranking in that organization. Submissions must be in writing and be received by the District GNT Coordinator at the time of registration for the event. The information submitted may be used to assign a conversion to ACBL masterpoints for purposes of verifying flight eligibility. Failure to submit this information as required will result in automatic disqualification of the team (Entry fees will not be refunded).

## ***Registration***

*Entering teams must receive confirmation either by email or letter. No team without confirmation should assume that entry has been verified. It is important to know in advance the number of teams entered. Captains should bring the confirmation with them to the site and be prepared to present it if needed when buying an entry.*

## ***Conventions***

The ACBL Open+ Chart shall be in effect for the Championship Flight.

The ACBL Open Chart shall be in effect for Flight A.

The ACBL Basic+ Chart shall be in effect for Flight B.

The ACBL Basic+ Chart shall be in effect for Flight C.

## ***Participation***

Each player is expected to play at least 50% of the boards scheduled for the event (not including tie-breaking playoffs). Each player must play at least 50% of the boards in the final and semi-final stages of the event. Team Captains are expected to come as close as possible to these requirements for each player. If a player is unable to play 50% of the

boards in any stage of the event, the deviation must be approved by the District Grand National Team Coordinator.

It is possible that the movements may require an anchor pair sitting NS. Captains should not assume that a five-person team will be able to substitute freely at both tables. It is also possible that the movement will prevent a player from playing 50% of the boards.

It is a Conduct and Ethics violation to list players on the entry who will not actually participate or to use players in early rounds when they will not play in later rounds. Any exceptions will be permitted only in the event of an emergency and at the sole discretion of the Grand National Team Coordinator.

**Players in the Championship Flight should not enter this event unless planning to play until eliminated. These players should expect to represent the District at the 2026 Summer North American Championship in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Captains should verify that all team members expect to play the entire event. Entering the event with the knowledge that one cannot compete throughout is a violation of ACBL guidelines.**

Winners in other flights are free to enter the District Final and declare their intentions at the end of the event. We encourage participation by those looking for great competition, great fun, and great hospitality.

### ***Special Qualifying Conditions for Flights B & C***

If eight or more teams enter the District competition in Flight B or Flight C, the District is entitled to send a second team to the National Finals. If the 1<sup>st</sup> place or 2<sup>nd</sup> place team elects not to enter the National Finals, the opportunity to play will be offered first to the 3<sup>rd</sup> place and then to the 4<sup>th</sup> place teams.

### ***Substitutes***

Substitutes are subject to the discretion of the Grand National Team Coordinator and may not appreciably strengthen a team. Substitutes for more than one session shall be deemed a permanent addition to the team.

### ***Appeals***

The period for an appeal of a director's ruling expires thirty minutes after each session.

### ***Corrections***

The period for score corrections expires at the announced starting time of the next session in an ongoing match, one hour before the announced starting time of the next session for the last session of a completed match, and fifteen minutes after the session for the last session of the final match.

## ***Penalties***

The penalties for failure to seat a complete team at announced game time (tardiness) in Stage 3 will be as follows:

- (i) first five minutes - no penalty
- (ii) more than 5 minutes, up to 15 minutes - 1 IMP
- (iii) more than 15 minutes, up to 20 minutes - 3 IMPs
- (iv) more than 20 minutes, up to 25 minutes - 6 IMPs
- (v) more than 25 minutes, up to 30 minutes - 9 IMPs
- (vi) more than 30 minutes, up to 35 minutes - 12 IMPs
- (vii) more than 35 minutes, up to 40 minutes - 15 IMPs

In Stage 1, the offending team may be required to use a substitute to facilitate the movement, in addition to the prescribed penalties.

The final match will be curtailed one board, up to a maximum of four boards, for each 7 1/2 minutes or fraction thereof of tardiness after the first ten minutes. Three IMPs per board curtailed will be awarded to the non-offending team in addition to the penalty in subsection (a) above.

If play has not commenced (with or without a substitute) forty minutes after the announced game time, the match will be declared a forfeit.

## ***Augmentation***

The winner of the event, if consisting of fewer than six members, may augment its team for advancement to the National Finals with any player or players approved by the District Grand National Coordinator. Augmented players are expected to be at least equal in strength to the other players on the team

## ***Entire Team Replacement***

Should circumstances arise where the winning team is unable to field at least three members of the original team, the team finishing second in the District Final will become the District representative. If the second place team is not available, the GNT coordinator may assemble a substitute team to represent the District. Whichever team actually represents the District will receive the District stipend. The goal of this provision is to make sure the District is represented, while respecting the results of the tournament insofar as that is possible.

## **ACBL Conditions**

The official ACBL GNT Conditions of Contest are incorporated as part of the District 13 Conditions. Any item that is not specifically addressed by the ACBL or District 13 GNT Conditions of Contest shall be subject to the ACBL General Conditions Contest.

### **Stipend**

Teams that represent the District at the National Finals will receive a stipend to help finance a trip to the NABC. Each team representing the District will receive a stipend of \$1,000 from the District. Payment of the stipend is contingent upon the team's participation in the National competition and the payment will be made after the completion of play at the National Finals.
